Computer systems & many information & communications technologies (ICT) are ubiquitous, working without them has become unthinkable &, a growing part of an organization's workforce relies extensively on home & portable computers, personal digital assistants, smart phones & other electronic tools. It also represents significant expenditures – often in the order 10,000 per employee – & ICT projects for a large enterprise can run into the tens of, & even hundreds, million Euro. Corporate Governance also requires that computer systems & data meet the appropriate national legal & regulatory obligations, & this, in turn, implies the governance of ICT of which only some components can be delegated to a Chief Information Officer or external service provider. The Information Technology Governance Institute (ITGI) framework & the International Standard ISO 38500 published in early 2008 are at the core of this workshop's contents.
